 - People will hate us
- Ephesians 6:12, I Peter 5:8
 - We are in a battle

What does encouragement do for us?



- John 13:34-35
 - Encouragement makes it easier for us to love as Jesus loved
- Romans 15:4
 - Encouragement gives hope
- Hebrews 12:5
 - Encouragement helps us through discipline/testing
- 1 Corinthians 13:4-7
 - Encouragement nurtures patience and kindness

How can we encourage each other?

 - Through scripture
- Philippians 2:3-4
 - Looking towards their interests
- Acts 20:1
 - Encouraging disciples

Dangers involved in encouragement
